### **Summary**

Meeting began at 2:05 p.m. Introductions were made around the room and the meeting agenda was reviewed.

Maggie Kaminoff thanked Megan Parish and Nicole Campbell for their assistance with Entiat's efforts in completing their consolidated grant application.

Nicole Campbell stated that over 800 surveys were submitted for the Mobility Council's data inquiry regarding regional transportation. There was a consensus of the Council that once the data is compiled and cleaned up, it will be available for all to use upon written inquiry to the Chair of the Council. Megan Parish mentioned that it will take time to clean the data and it would be ideal to possibly find a student or community member who would be interested in volunteering for the project. Rosenda Henley said she would do research and find a volunteer for the data collection clean-up.

Maggie Kaminoff stated that the [Okanogan County Transportation and Nutrition](#) (OCTN) accepted an invitation to join the Mobility Council (MC). The OCTN will host the next MC meeting on October 17, 2018 from 2 – 3:30 p.m. Maggie suggested that MC members carpool to Okanogan and will send a follow-up email with more information.

Nicole Campbell presented an update of the WSDOT Consolidated Grant Program. Nicole distributed a Regional Priority Ranking Recommendations handout and explained the project ranking process. Maggie gave a brief overview of "needs" and stated that Entiat would greatly benefit from the funding award. Upon discussion and review of the priority ranking recommendations, by consensus (with
